Post Prop 8 Plans

SAN FRANCISCO (KCBS) -- Gay rights activists are figuring out their next move now that California has approved a same-sex marriage ban.

In San Francisco, several options are being considered to get Proposition 8 overturned.

Lawsuits are popping up. California Attorney General Jerry Brown has been asked by the State Supreme Court to respond by Monday to a filing by the National Center for Lesbian Rights, LAMBDA, and the ACLU against Proposition 8.

Lesbian activist Cat Kim believes efforts will begin at the grassroots level. "We're calling for a unified movement, for people to write to their elected officials and say, "I do support marriage equality," said Kim.

A meeting will be held at the Veterans War Memorial at 6:30 Thursday night.

A more outrageous protest planned for December 10th is likely to get more attention. On "Day Without a Gay," organizers are threatening a ban on makeup, opera, fashion and Beyonce.

"It is going to be a horrible day for the straight people of America," proclaimed the announcer.
